FOUR PILLARS OF A HEALTHY CHURCH



In current times, when the devil's deceptions are evident everywhere, the philosophy of Health Ministries is to encourage church

means of divine grace, to harmonize their lifestyle with God's health laws. As Seventh-day Adventists, we are to live what we preach.

The health message of the Church is worthless, unless we practice what we promote and preach. Many souls could be carried to the feet of Jesus by teaching and practicing healthy habits.

As we observe Health Ministries Day, I would like to share with you four pillars of a healthy church as outlined by the Inter-American Division of Seventh-day Adventists. The pillars are; Prayer, Prevention, Practice and Proclaim.

A healthy church must pray. Prayer is the opening of the heart to God as to a friend. Not that it is necessary in order to make known to God what we want, but in order to enable us to receive Him. "Prayer does not bring God down to us but brings us up to Him". Steps to Christ 93. God's prevailing power is released in the lives of people who pray. To pray is direct communication with God. It is to receive power from God. It is to have constant communication with the Creator so that we can gain understanding and wisdom and to love and serve those we call our neighbors.

A healthy church endeavors to prevent. Prevention is an anticipated action to avoid wrong doings. It is to read, to study, and learn everything about what the Bible, the Spirit of Prophecy and Scientific studies say on health and then incorporate it into your life. It is far better to prevent diseases than to know how to treat it when contracted.

Prevention is to know that: We should drink 8-9 glasses of water per day; we should rest 7-8 hours per day; we should exercise at least 30 - 50 minutes per day, and if possible outdoors; we should eat a balanced diet three times per day. Lastly, we should communicate with God on a daily basis through the study of The Word and prayer.

A healthy church must practice. As we are empowered, we should put into practice what we know and preach. We must tell about the Goodness of the Lord as found in the Great Commission of Matt. 28:18 – 20.

A healthy church must proclaim. To Proclaim is to evangelize. It is not to condemn, accuse or try to change others, It is to teach persons with our examples. "It is of little use to try to reform others by attacking what we may regard as wrong habits. Such effort often results in more harm than good." *MH 156*. Proclaiming is to share what we have learnt. It is to open our churches and make them centers of service to others. It is to teach them who is the author of our lives, and the sustainer of our health and our happiness.

As we near the end of this year and embark on 2019 I encourage all of you to pray, prevent, practice and proclaim, so that we can be transformed by His grace to heal & serve."




