STEWARDSHIP THROUGH PLANNED GIVING



Have you ever considered what would happen to your assets after you have passed away? Would your wishes be complied with? How would your family be cared for? Would all of your debts be serviced?

Everyone should have an estate plan comprising of either a will or a trust. A will is a legal document that will allow you to determine how your assets are distributed after you die. A trust allows you to control how your assets are handled both during and after your lifetime.

How wonderful it would be to see just how your gifts can impact the work of God and His church? This can be done through proper planning. Remember that if you die without a will, the courts will decide just who benefits from your assets and they will not provide for any charitable intentions that you may have.

On the other hand, establishing a trust will require that you transfer ownership of your assets to the name of your trust. This way the courts will have no control over your assets when you die. You may spend a few dollars more to set up a trust but in the long run, you would have saved on court costs and time for disbursing of your assets. This can all be arranged through the services of an experienced estate planning attorney.

You can be instrumental in advancing the mission of God's church and hasten His coming even in your absence. Some areas of giving can include but are not limited to:

- 1 A cash amount
- 2 The sale of real estate or a portion of the sale
- 3 Proceeds from a life insurance
- 4 An annual percentage from a rental property
- 5 Cash from the sale of certain items

Let us remember that all that we have belongs to God and we are stewards entrusted to manage these gifts for Him. Everything, as we know it, will one day become firewood. Therefore we should remember to "lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: for where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6: 20, 21).

Our watchword should be 'love', love for God and love for our fellowman. As we go through this life, let us endeavor to be faithful in our stewardship, loyal to our Master, and true to our calling. -Elder Anthony Burrows, Stewardship and Trust Director

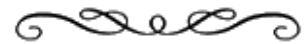
