

needs, and won their confidence. Then He bade them, 'Follow Me'" (Ellen G. White, *The Ministry of Healing*, p. 143).

It is simple: giving a listening ear when someone needs to talk, giving emotional support, feeding the hungry, giving shelter to the homeless, clothing the naked and praying for and with an individual are some of the things that we can do through ministry. Jesus desired the good of the whole person, physical, emotional and spiritual.

When Jesus left earth, He left us the great commission of saving souls. "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world" (Matt 28: 19-20). However, before we teach and baptize, we are mandated to minister to the physical needs of individuals.

Every member of the church is called to follow the example of Jesus by meeting the mental, physical, social, and spiritual needs of persons in their communities.

"If less time were given to sermonizing, and more time were spent in personal ministry, greater results would be seen. The poor are to be relieved, the sick cared for, the sorrowing and the bereaved comforted, the ignorant instructed, the inexperienced counseled. We are to weep with those that weep and rejoice with those that rejoice. Accompanied by the power of persuasion, the power of prayer, the power of the love of God, this work will not, cannot, be without fruit" (MH 143).

When we minister to our neighbors, colleagues and persons in the wider community as Jesus did, introducing them to Christ, we will be well received. Persons will come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ and He will soon return.


