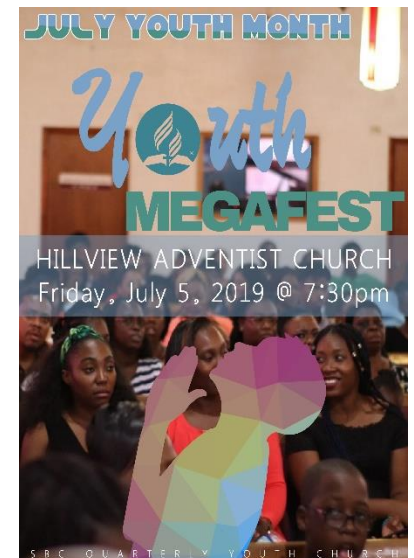
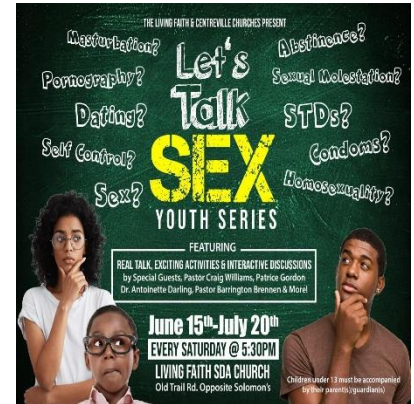


YOUTH MIDWEEK SERVICE
